25th Anniversary of the Formation of 16 Geographic Support Squadron RE

After ten years of research and writing Alan has finished the story of 42 Survey Engineer Regiment Royal Engineers and the book will be published in 2021 as a limited edition. There will be an opportunity to pre-order and details will follow in the new year.
